link between the Jain community and the academic world. Although the Jain community is relatively small, it has historically had and continues to have a large impact on Indian religious, social and cultural life. The academic study of Jainism is still an underdeveloped area of research. The spirit of the ISSJS is to work towards rectifying this omission in scholarly inquiry by fostering an interest in Jainism in universities and colleges around the world.

ISSJS programs are financially supported by International School for Jain Studies (ISJS), a project of Mahavir Vision Inc, a non-profit tax exempt organization under the U.S. Internal Revenue Code §501(c)(3). ISJS also works in collaboration with Academic Studies of Jainism in North America (ASJNA), World Council of Jain Academies (WCJA), Jain Academic Foundation of North America (JAFNA), University of Ottawa, American Institute of Indian Studies (AIIS) and Shastri Indo Canadian Institute (SICI). In addition, ISJS has affiliations with similar organizations in Thailand and the U.K

The entire program in India and overseas is run and administered by the International School for Jain Studies in New Delhi, India, an independent organization registered in India as a non-profit, tax exempt organization under § 80G of the Indian Revenue Law.

ISSJS programs were started in 2005.

Since then, 123 participants have benefitted by attending these programs in five annual summer programs. In 2009, ISSJS was also organized at Mahidol University in Bangkok Thailand. The participants to earlier ISSJSs came from eighteen universities and eight countries of the world.



The ISSJS program is intended to provide scholarsincluding faculty, graduate students, and selected undergraduate students who are associated with accredited universities and colleges in the areas of philosophy, religion, anthropology, theology and South Asian studiesan opportunity to pursue academic Jain studies and to experience Jainism in a variety of practical settings in India. The 2010 program will run from May 26th to July 8th 2010. During this period the participants will study in the cities of Mumbai, Jaipur, Varanasi and Delhi (including Hastinapur) and will also undertake several one-day pilgrimages to selected Jain historic and holy places.

The ISSJS course of study follows a daily schedule of academic lectures by reputed Jain scholars covering a range of topics including Jain history, philosophy, rituals, ethics and contemporary Jain life. An important part of this program is the opportunity to contextualize what is learned in the classroom by visiting academic and historical places of interest, as well as by interacting with the Jain community and participating in cultural activities.

In addition, ISSJS also provides some opportunities to learn languages like

Prakrat and Sanskrit and to study Jain scriptural texts such as Acaranga, Uttradhyana, Rattankarand Shravakachar, and Samayasara.

These specialized programs will be in the afternoons and require a minimum participation of three students.

This program is open only to faculty and graduate/undergraduate students in the related areas of study and engaged in teaching or research, or pursuing advanced studies, at any accredited university or college worldwide. All participants are expected to be fluent in English since this program is offered using English as the primary medium of instruction.

Specialization in Jainism is not required. However, applicants should have some prior experience in the study of South Asia and its religious traditions, or

knowledge of Hindi/ Sanskrit/ Prakrat, and have the desire to integrate the study of Jainism into their work in these fields. Although this is a non sectarian program, applicants must be willing to respectfully adhere to certain Jain principles while in India during the program because they will be interacting with the Jain community and participating in Jain cultural events.
