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Er. Apollo Kasliwal describes Higgs Boson--

What is Higgs Boson ? How it was discovered and what is its significance? What are black holes? What is theory of relativity?

Many more such questions were answered and various mysteries of the universe were explained very lucidly by JES Er. Apollo Kasliwal, Senior Scientist at RRCAT, Indore through his audio visual presentation to a crowd of more than 5000 which included school children from Indore and nearby cities and invited guests at a jam packed Basket Ball Complex, Indore on 4th November . The presentation which went on for more than 2 hours was organized by a premium IIT coaching institute "Catalyser".

Er. Apollo informed that without Higgs Boson, this universe would not have existed the way it is today. No life would have come into being. Higgs gives mass to other atomic particles. The name "boson" has been given in the honour of great Indian Scientist Shri Satyendra Nath Bose who worked with Albert Einstein and gave very important theories on "Bosons" which laid the foundation for discovery of much touted "Higgs Boson".

Mr. Kasliwal told that Higgs Boson was discovered in the biggest particle accelerator ever built on this earth "LHC" at CERN, Switzerland. He explained the whole set up of the LHC project and its purpose. LHC is basically a 27 kilometer ring built 100 meters below the earth at France and Switzerland border in Geneva. He said with the help of the project we will find out many such things which would be beneficial for the betterment and development of the society at global level.

We may find out the exact answer of what dark matter or dark energy is? why gravity is so weak ? Some more fundamental particles may be discovered. We know only three dimensions and time is considered the fourth dimension. At LHC we may find many more extra dimensions though they may be very very small.

Er. Apollo informed that the project has been established with whopping Rs. 60,000 crore in which more than 45 nations across the world have participated. India has also actively participated in the execution of the project. Er. Kasliwal spent a year at CERN, Geneva to work on LHC project.

At the end of the session Er. Apollo answered many queries of the crowd related to basic sciences and rightly said that to be a scientist one has not only to study science but live it every moment.



Hindu Law for Jains : Supreme Court sends notice to Center

The Supreme Court has issued notice to the Centre, seeking its response within six weeks on a plea for a "separate and distinct" identity for Sikhs in laws relating to succession, adoption, divorce and maintenance. The petitioners Birendra Kaur and Rohit Garg questioned the wisdom of including Sikhs, Jains and Buddhists under the laws were meant only for the Hindus, if one were to go by the titles. "When all the four religions stand admittedly on an equal footing and are independent of each other, is it right for the legislature?" to mention just one religion in the title, they wanted to know.

शरीरमाघं खलु धर्मसाधनम् :

एलाचार्य प्रज्ञसागर मुनिराज

जैन डॉक्टर्स फेडरेशन दिल्ली द्वारा आयोजित ८वीं ऑल इंडिया जैन डॉक्टर्स कान्फ्रेंस के पुनीत अवसर पर "Science with Spirituality for Global Peace & Harmony" कान्फ्रेंस को सम्बोधित करते हुए परमपूज्य श्वेतपिच्छाचार्य श्री विद्यानन्दजी मुनिराज के परमशिष्य परमपूज्य एलाचार्य श्री प्रज्ञसागरजी मुनिराज ने अपने मंगल उद्बोधन में कहा - करोड़ों वर्ष पूर्व भगवान आदिनाथ ने साधक व श्रावक को धर्मध्यान करने के लिए सर्वप्रथम शरीर विज्ञान का ज्ञान दिया था, उन्होंने कहा -

"धर्मसाधनमाघं हि शरीरमिहदेहिनाम्।

तस्य धारणमाधेयं यथाशक्ति च शासने।।" - (आचार्य जिनसेन, हरिवंशपुराण, १८/१४३)

इस मनुष्य पर्याय में शरीर ही प्राणियों का सबसे पहला धर्म का साधन है, इसलिए यथाशक्ति उसकी रक्षा करनी चाहिए। यह जैनशासन (आगम) का विधान है।

८-९वीं शताब्दी में आचार्य पूज्यपाद ने मन-वचन-काय के स्वस्थ होने के लिए तीन प्रकार के ग्रन्थ लिखे। मन स्वस्थ होने के लिए समाधितंत्र, वचन शुद्ध होने के लिए जिनेन्द्रव्याकरण तथा काय शुद्ध होने के लिए कल्याणकारक। आचार्य पूज्यपाद स्वामी ने कल्याणकारक ग्रन्थ में एक महत्त्वपूर्ण बात लिखी है जो साधक अपने आरोग्य शरीर का सुख नहीं भोग सकता वह सिद्धों का सुख भी नहीं भोग सकता। द्वादशांग में १२ वों दृष्टिवाद है, उसके ५ भेदों में से अंतिम पूर्वगत भेद है और उसके १४ भेदों में प्राणावाद नाम का पूर्व है, इसी के अंतर्गत अष्टांग आयुर्वेद का विस्तृत वर्णन मिलता है। हमारे जैनाचार्यों ने अनेक ग्रन्थ शल्य-चिकित्सा एवं काय-चिकित्सा के उपर लिखे। आपको जानकर यह आश्चर्य होगा कि जैन आचार्य द्वारा रचित पुष्पायुर्वेद नामक ग्रन्थ रचा, जिसमें १८,००० पुष्पों का वर्णन है। पुष्पों के माध्यम से होने वाली ५,८६,६६,५८४ रोगों को दूर करने की विधियाँ इसमें बताई गई हैं।

परमपूज्य एलाचार्य श्री ने जैनधर्म के अध्यात्म रहस्य को बहुत सूक्ष्मता से समझाया कि रोग हमारे शरीर में Passion (क्रोध) के कारण होते हैं। चार प्रकार के कषाय के विषय में बताया। 1. Anger (क्रोध), 2. Pride (मान), 3. Deceitful Nature (मायाचारी) और 4. Greed (लोभ)। Anger करने से Brain Hemorrhage, Eye, Hair, Nose, Throat, Mouth आदि के रोग पैदा होते हैं। Pride करने से Heart संबंधी अनेक बीमारियाँ होती हैं। Deceitful Nature से Stomach, Liver, Kidney आदि में रोगों की उत्पत्ति होती है। Greed करने से Hands, Legs में paralysis आदि की अनेक बीमारियाँ उत्पन्न होती हैं। एलाचार्यश्री ने कहा - हम सभी को यदि Illness to Wellness होने के लिए Natural जीवन जीना चाहिए। जैनधर्म Scientific धर्म है, वह जीवन जीने की कला, कब, कैसे, कहाँ, क्या खाना, क्या पीना आदि बातों में Science के आधार पर बतलाता है। हम इतना ही कह सकते हैं कि भगवान महावीर स्वामी A Great Scientist हैं और हमें उन्हीं के बताये हुए धर्म मार्ग पर चलकर अपने मन-वचन-काय को स्वस्थ एवं सुन्दर करना चाहिए। इसी उपलक्ष्य में श्वेताम्बर समाज के परमपूज्य श्री नयपद्मसागरजी महाराज ने भी अपने सारगर्भित व्याख्यान में जैन डॉक्टर्स को मार्गदर्शन दिया।

Walt Disney's Success Story

Success begins with a Dream

“When you wish upon a star...” begins the song used as a theme for Disney television programs, and, perhaps, a theme for the entire Disney operation.

Walt Disney was a man of dreams. He dreamed big dreams. And he made his dreams come true.

Walt Disney would agree, and is himself ample proof, that dreams can come true. His example reveals that making dreams come true takes more than just wishing. In Walt's case, the “star” was Mickey Mouse, and combined with a lot of vision, planning, and hard work, Walt made dream after dream come true.

Most people think of Walt Disney as an animator, the “inventor” of Mickey Mouse. He is more accurately thought of as an entertainer, not in the sense that he wanted to be the center of attention, but that he wanted to create something that would excite an audience and make them laugh.

Walt had talent, and developed a keen commercial sense of what would appeal to the public. This combination enabled him to parlay \$40 and a few drawing tools into a film studio producing popular cartoons, feature length animated features, and live action movies.

Disneyland, Walt Disney World, and ultimately the other Disney theme parks around the world all came about because Walt Disney insisted that he could build an amusement park that was so much bigger and better than other amusement parks that it shouldn't even be called an amusement park.

How did this dream come about?

As a child in Kansas City, Walt watched through the fence at Fairmont Park, wanting to participate, but not having enough money to enter.

A parent in the 1930's, Walt would take his children to amusement parks. But he was not amused, convinced he could do much better. By 1937, at the premiere of Snow White, Walt told Wilfred Jackson that someday he would “make a park for kids, a place scaled down to kid size.”

In 1940 he revealed a plan to showcase Disney characters in their fantasy surroundings at a park across the street from the Disney studio in Burbank.

The vision of an amusement park grew in Walt's mind as he traveled through the US and Europe and visited attractions of all kinds. He visited county fairs, state fairs, circuses, carnivals, and parks. He was distressed at operations where things were run down and ride operators were hostile. And he loved the spotless Tivoli Gardens in Copenhagen, with bright, upbeat music, excellent food and drink, and warm, friendly employees.

Walt was convinced that an amusement park would be successful in the United States if it offered a “good show”

that families could enjoy together, was clean, and had friendly employees.

In 1948 he shared his concept with trusted friends, a modest amusement park with a central village including a town hall, a small park, railroad station movie theater, and small stores. Outlying areas would include a carnival area and a western village. Soon he added spaceship and submarine rides, a steamboat, and exhibit halls.

Four years later, in 1952, he decided on “Disneyland” for the name and formed a company to develop the park, Disneyland, Inc.

Walt's brother Roy, the studio's financial head, was against investing in Disneyland. Bankers and amusement industry experts forecast doom. That's why Walt stepped outside the studio organization to develop the idea. Eventually Roy agreed to help, and the Disney studio became part of the operation.

In 1953 Walt brilliantly strategized combining television production with development of the park. The Disneyland television program on ABC had a dual benefit. It promoted the new park through a weekly program, and it became part of a deal where the network invested half a million dollars plus substantial loan guarantees in return for a 35% ownership in Disneyland Park.

That same year he enlisted Stanford Research Institute to examine the economic prospects of Disneyland (it was deemed profitable) and to find the ideal location (Anaheim).

They broke ground in July, 1954, and one year later, on July 17, 1955, Disneyland opened.

Within 7 weeks, a million visitors had visited Disneyland, making it one of the biggest tourist attractions in the US. Attendance was 50 per cent ahead of predictions and guests were spending 30 per cent more than expected.

Walt combined his talent and his sense of what the public would want with lots of hard work. Today we might call him a “workaholic.” His work was driven, not by guilt or insecurity, but by a dream. As he told an interviewer in 1955: “Everybody can make their dreams come true. It takes a dream... faith in it... and hard work. But that's not quite true because it's so much fun you hardly realize it's work.”

At a dinner party at Herb Ryman's house in 1960, someone commented that Walt could be elected president if he wanted it. His response? “Why would I want to be President of the United States? I'm the King of Disneyland!”

In 1960, after 37 years in Hollywood, with a mixture of huge successes and frustrating setbacks, Disney had created something that was successful beyond Walt's own dreams. With Disneyland and its continuing stream of visitors, Walt had finally achieved financial stability.
